ASSESSING READINESS

The 3 Primary Indicators for Wraparound Transition

The Wraparound timeline for transition is individualized and is indicated by various factors. The 3 primary indicators for transition are:

1 YOUTH AND FAMILY

Wraparound is youth driven and family guided.



Though transition is impacted by other indicators, the youth and family are the ultimate decision makers.

ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS: CANS

CANS can highlight progress and ongoing needs. However, CANS ratings should not delay or override the other factors when assessing readiness for transition.

2 TEAM MISSION

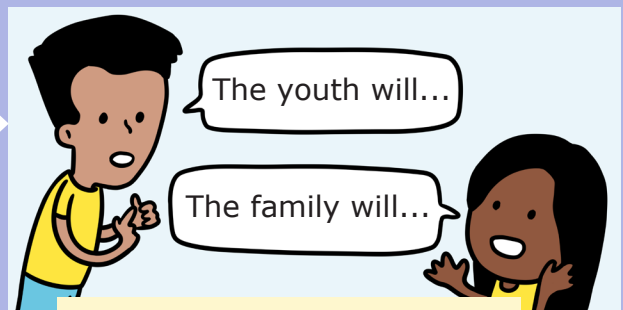
The team mission includes the goals the Wraparound team intends to accomplish together during the Wraparound process.



The team should regularly assess if these goals have been met. If not, the team should discuss next steps.

3 NEEDS AND OUTCOME STATEMENTS

Outcome statements measure when a need is met...



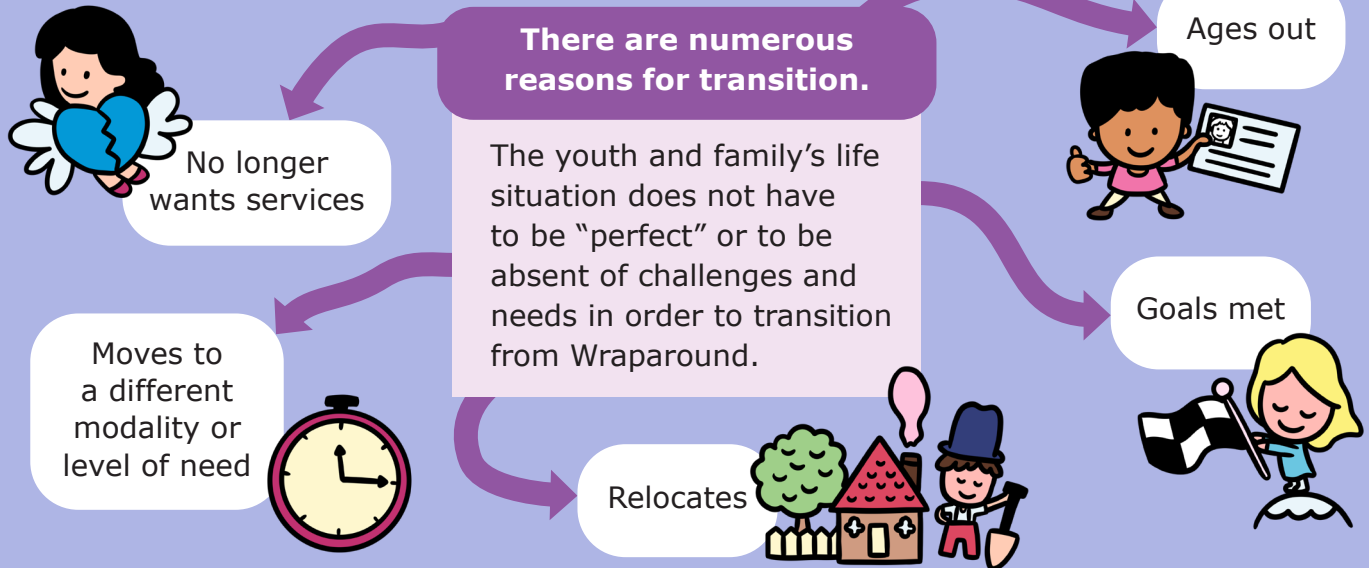
...thus moving the team closer to transition.

Note: The team mission, needs, and outcomes do not have to be 100% met in order to move into the Transition phase.

ASSESSING THE YOUTH AND FAMILY'S READINESS TO TRANSITION

The youth, family, or Wraparound team has expressed concern regarding transition.

What do I do?

- 1** Seek to understand; use open-ended questions.
- 2** Normalize and validate their concerns.
- 3** Reflect on successes and accomplishments.
- 4** Create a plan to address the concerns:
 - What can you do when things get hard?
 - Who can you reach out to for support?
 - How will you ask for help?
 - Under what circumstances would you want to re-enter services?
